Program Mission and Outcomes

The Digital Filmmaking program is designed to prepare students for entry-level and self-employment in the film and television fields. Students given basic skills in all aspects of film and video production & post-production: camera operation, lighting and cinematography, sound recording, video editing, sound design and creation, color correction and visual effects. Emphasis is placed on hands on, experiential learning. Students given access to professional level equipment to produce both individual and collaborative projects and gain the necessary skills to enter the entertainment workforce.

Outcomes:

- Demonstrate an understanding of concept, design and creation of film projects.
- Demonstrate an ability to work collaboratively to produce film projects.
- Engage creativity and original thinking in the production of a film project.
- Develop a career path in the film and television industry.
