PROGRAM INFORMATION

Due to the rigorous and competitive audition requirement of all university music programs, music students planning to transfer to the university should be willing to spend additional time in preparation for this essential component of their music career. Additional courses may be advisable.

An extended residence at LBCC may be advisable for any of the following reasons:

- a.) Weakness in piano or performance area of concentration
- b.) English or mathematics limitations
- c.) Entrance requirements at school of transfer
- d.) Personal considerations such as employment or elective courses

NOTE: Enrollment in a **performance organization** is required each semester. At the discretion of the conductor the student has an option of enrolling in MUSIC 46AD (College Symphonic Band- Fall semester), MUSIC 47AD (Evening Wind Symphony), MUSIC 38AD (Wind Ensemble-Spring Semester), MUSIC 11AD (College Chorale), MUSIC 20AD (Evening College Choir), MUSIC 14AD (Orchestra), or MUSIC 13AD (College Symphony Orchestra).

Music students with no previous keyboard study should plan to take as many semesters of piano as possible in order to be assured of meeting entrance requirements at the college of transfer. Four semesters are recommended.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

For **ASSOCIATE DEGREE**:

The Associate Degree is a two-year college degree awarded by Long Beach City College which includes general education courses and major course of study. Complete the required units listed above with a minimum grade of "C" in each. In addition, complete the A.A. degree requirements specified in the Catalog. The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout (see the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment"). Fifty per cent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration must be completed in residence (credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included).

NOTE: To receive a degree you must submit completed application forms in the Admissions and Records Office during your final semester of course work.

In general, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement

SUGGESTED SEQUENCE OF COURSES

This is not an educational plan, as course offerings, student schedules, and circumstances vary. Students must meet all the prerequisites in order to be eligible for the sequence of courses.
