- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 10 units of the required 20 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- General Education and Proficiency Requirements: Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements\*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at <u>http://osca.lbcc.edu</u>.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <a href="http://admissions.lbcc.edu/">http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</a>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<a href="http://schedule.lbcc.edu">http://schedule.lbcc.edu</a>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

\*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

The <u>Associate Degree</u> will prepare students for a mechanical-design-related career, and appropriate course selection will facilitate transfer to a professional degree program.

The <u>Core Skills Certificate of Achievement</u> will prepare students for an entry-level position as a mechanical drafter trainee in a variety of design professional settings and will serve as a foundation for specialization.

The <u>Advanced Skills Certificate of Achievement</u> will prepare student for an advanced position as a mechanical drafter or intermediate level drafting position in a variety of design professional settings and will serve as a foundation for specialization.
