- 2. **Scholarship:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this **field of concentration, complete each course above** with a **grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 4. **Residence for the Field of Concentration**: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means:

For the Newspaper/Magazine Emphasis, complete at least 12 units of the required 23 at Long Beach City College. For the Public Relations Emphasis, complete at least 10 units of the required 19 at Long Beach City College. For the Public Relations Emphasis, complete at least 12 units of the required 23 at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.

- 5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

Suggested Sequence of Classes

This is not an educational plan, as course offerings, student schedules, and circumstances vary. Students must meet all the prerequisites in order to be eligible for the sequence of courses. Career Opportunities

This field of concentration, with an emphasis in Newspapers/Magazines, provides a basic program for students interested in careers requiring journalistic training, such as newspaper or internet reporting, magazine or free-lance writing.

The emphasis in **Public Relations** provides a basic program for students interested in careers in any aspect of public relations and in writing and editing in-house or web sites.

The **Publication Specialist** emphasis provides a basic program for students interested in learning to produce a variety of publications including newsletters, brochures, web sites, proposals, and house magazines.

The **Certificate of Achievement** provides access to entry-level employment in a variety of journalism related fields. These include newspapers, magazines, web sites, newsletters, and press relation offices.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The journalism program prepares students with a body of knowledge and a system of inquiry, scholarship and training for careers in which they are accountable to the public interest for their knowledge, ethics, competence and service; to citizens, clients or consumers for their competencies and the quality of their work; and to employers for their performance.

Outcomes:

- Gather and prepare material accurately and fairly while meeting deadlines.
- Apply teamwork skills to publish a newspaper, magazine, or website.
