For graduation with an Associate in Science Degree in Photography:

1. Units: Complete a minimum of 60 units, distributed as follows:

Photography Major: 43 units General Education/A.S. 19 units Electives/Other courses: 0 units TOTAL: 62 units

- 2. Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- Residence for the Degree: Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 22 units of the required 43 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included. Students must complete each course counted toward the major or area of emphasis with a grade of "C" or better.
- General Education and Proficiency Requirements: Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/ . Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

For graduation with a **Certificate of Achievement in Photography:**

- 1. Complete each of the REQUIRED COURSES listed above with a minimum grade of "C" and a minimum grade point average of 3.0.
- 2. Fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration must be completed in residence; this means at least 22 units of the required 43 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 3. Complete and submit the certificate application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

Career Opportunities

Students learn entry level skills necessary to embark upon a career in the photography industry. It includes emphasis on practical applications leading to career advancement.

This **Certificate of Achievement** will prepare students for employment in a wide range of professional photographic careers with their studies in Portraiture, Studio Lighting, Photography for Publication, Photography on Location, Experimental and Fine Art. Additionally the traditional and digital approaches train students for technical careers in both digital media and the arts.

This **Associate Degree** will prepare students for career advancement once a certificate has been earned. Appropriate course selection will also facilitate transfer to a four-year college or university.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of the Art and Photography Department at Long Beach City College is to provide students instruction in the visual arts whether beginning, advanced, or professional with a single class, general education courses, or a course of study, leading to transfer, Associate Degree, or a vocational certificate. Students can pursue their individual interests in the visual arts through an array of foundation courses establishing a technical and critical understanding of visual language.

These courses lead to improved personal creative expression or to specialized instruction in numerous areas within the creative and applied arts. The arts involve students in the process of their learning, demanding constant reflection and active participation. The arts enable students to collaborate toward a common purpose. The arts are a powerful connection force between disciplines. As our world and problems become more complex, creative thinking becomes all the more important.

Outcomes:

- Produce professional quality photographic artwork that demonstrates skill, craftsmanship, comprehension of visual design, and aesthetic conceptual rigor.
- Develop a foundation of skills, craft, traditional and digital technologies where ideas and concepts are communicated through the production of photographic images.
- Analyze, interpret, and exercise critical judgment in the evaluation of visual artwork.
