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Associate Degree requirements continued from the previous page:

For graduation with an Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree with a major in Radio/Television Broadcast News:

1. **Units**: Complete a minimum of 60 units, distributed as follows:

Radio/Television Broadcast News Major: 42 units
General Education/A.A. 25 units
Electives/Other courses: 0 units
TOTAL: 67 units

- Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work
 applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a
 grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 4. **Residence for the Field of Concentration**: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at **least 21 units** of the required 42 must be **completed at Long Beach City College**. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

For graduation with a R/TV Broadcast News Certificate of Achievement:

Career Opportunities

Students prepare for writing, editing, and producing radio or television news and news feature programs.

This Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position or provide skills for advancement in the fast growing field of Broadcast News and related information distribution elements of various industries.

The Associate Degree will prepare students for career advancement in this field. Appropriate course selection will also facilitate transfer to a four-year college or university in communications, broadcast, or journalism.

Program Mission and Outcomes

This program's mission is to provide an academic (AA degree), a certificate, and the personal preparation for successful transfer to a university, Digital Media Arts, or Broadcast Mews program and to provide Vocational training and skills to successfully gain an internship or employment in the Radio/Television News and media entertainment/news industry, as well as to provide a General Education course necessary to fulfill transfer requirements, and to provide meaningful and vital opportunities and outreach to the community at large to engage in the creation of radio-television and multi-media news productions.

- Integrate and arrange script, graphics, B-roll, music, and soundbites into a industry ready newscast segment.
- Critically assess the responsibilities of various creative and technical staff positions and evaluate the importance of each to the production.
