- Minimum grade and GPA requirements: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) in all CSU-transferable coursework. For the major complete each course with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC.
- 4. Degree Application: Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <u>http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</u>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<u>http://schedule.lbcc.edu</u>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.
