For graduation with an Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree with a major in Fashion Design:

1. Minimum Unit Requirements: Any course that appears on a curriculum guide and the General Education Pattern (Plan A) may fulfill both major and general education requirements (Approved by College Curriculum Committee Spring 2012). For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.:

> Fashion Design Major: 32.5 - 33 units General Education/A.A. Minimum Total Units:

25 units 60 units

- Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work 2. applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis, and minimum gpa in the concentration of 2.5.
- Residence for the Degree: Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 4 Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 17 units of the required 32.5 - 33must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- General Education and Proficiency Requirements: Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and 5. Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu .
- 6. Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/ Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Career Opportunities

Fashion Design:

Students prepare for entry-level jobs in fashion design, production & manufacturing. This program also provides partial lower division preparation for the baccalaureate degree in Fashion Design.

Job Opportunities:

Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. With beginning starting salary ranging from: \$10/hour - \$25/hour. Designer, Production Manager, Pattern Drafter, Pattern Grader, Technical Designer, Quality Control, Shipping Manager, Sample-maker, Textile Designer, and Manufacturers Representative.

The Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position in the apparel design and manufacturing industry.

This <u>Associate Degree</u> will prepare students for career advancement once a certificate has been earned. Field of concentration selection will also facilitate transfer in a related major.

Fashion Design—Patternmaker:

Job Opportunities

Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. Starting salary ranges from: \$10/hour - \$20/hour. Production Manager, Pattern Drafter, Pattern Grader, Quality Control, Samplemaker, Technical Designer.

Fashion Design—Samplemaker:

Job Opportunities

Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. Starting salary range: \$8/hour - \$20/hour. Samplemaker, Sample Cutter, Quality Control.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of the Fashion Design Program at LBCC is to provide students with discipline specific skills to communicate effectively, think critically, and possess the knowledge of technology essential to employment in design related occupations within the fashion industry or the requisite foundation for transfer to a 4-year college or university.

- Create an environment that promotes critical thinking, creativity, teamwork, soft skills, multicultural and global awareness and understanding of social organizational and technological systems.
- Provide educational opportunities in the field of fashion for career employment, advanced study & professional.
- Predict fashion trends and analyze form, silhouette, proportion, texture and drape of fabric to develop a fashion line for a target customer.
