For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.

Associate Degree requirements continued from the previous page:

- Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work 2. applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- Residence for the Degree: Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in 3. residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 4 Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence: this means at least 12 units of the required 23 - 24 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 5. General Education and Proficiency Requirements: Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu .
- 6. Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/ Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Career Opportunities

Students prepare for employment as floral designers. Students completing this Certificate of Achievement will also have the basic knowledge to become a salesperson, manager, or owner of a floral shop. The certificate will help students prepare for AIFD certification.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of the floral design program is the development of student competency for employment as floral designers.

- 1. Knowledge and skills for acceptable floral displays: Develop foundational knowledge and skills for the design and production of industry acceptable floral displays.
- 2. Work place competencies in floral design: Develop work place competencies needed for employment in the floral design field.
- 3. Evaluation of floral art forms: Analyze, interpret and exercise critical judgment in the evaluation of floral art forms
