Students are encouraged to take 12 or more units in one of the following fields which are representative of fields in which publications and Internet employment may exist: Administration of Justice, Business/Marketing, Commercial Music/Radio-TV, Computer Art, English, Health Services/Pre-Medicine, Human Services, Manufacturing & Trades, Sociology, Economics, Physical Education/Recreation, Social Services, Public Affairs/Administration, Political Science, Science, Banking/Finance, Child Development, Environmental Science, or Hotel/Restaurant Management.

Suggested Sequence of Classes

This is not an educational plan, as course offerings, student schedules, and circumstances vary. Students must meet all the prerequisites in order to be eligible for the sequence of courses. A suggested full-time sample sequence of courses for the required 60 units to reach an Associate Degree includes:

Career Opportunities

This field of concentration, with an emphasis in Newspapers/Magazines, provides a basic program for students interested in careers requiring journalistic training, such as newspaper or internet reporting, magazine or free-lance writing.

The emphasis in **Public Relations** provides a basic program for students interested in careers in any aspect of public relations and in writing and editing in-house or web sites.

The **Publication Specialist** emphasis provides a basic program for students interested in learning to produce a variety of publications including newsletters, brochures, web sites, proposals, and house magazines.

The **Certificate of Achievement** provides access to entry-level employment in a variety of journalism related fields. These include newspapers, magazines, web sites, newsletters, and press relation offices.

The **Photojournalism Certificate of Achievement** provides students with the ability to learn the entry-level skills necessary to embark upon a career in the news online and documentary photography field. It includes emphasis in practical applications leading to career advancement.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The journalism program prepares students with a body of knowledge and a system of inquiry, scholarship and training for careers in which they are accountable to the public interest for their knowledge, ethics, competence and service; to citizens, clients or consumers for their competencies and the quality of their work; and to employers for their performance.

Outcomes:

- Gather and prepare material accurately and fairly while meeting deadlines.
- Apply teamwork skills to publish a newspaper, magazine, or website.
