- Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 semester units of the required 60 semester units in residence at Long Beach City College in order for the college to grant an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science Degree.
- Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 15-16.5 units of the required 30-33 units. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at <u>http://osca.lbcc.edu</u>.
- 6. Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <u>http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</u>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<u>http://schedule.lbcc.edu</u>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the years of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".
