1. <b>Minimum Unit Requirements:</b> <u>Any course that appears on a curriculum guide and the General Education Pattern (Plan A) may fulfill both major and general education requirements (Approved by College Curriculum Committee Spring 2012).</u> For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.

2. **Scholarship:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this **field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 semester units of the required 60 semester units in residence at Long Beach City College in order for the college to grant an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science Degree.
4. **Residence for the Field of Concentration:** Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at **least 15-16.5 units** of the required 30-33 units. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements\*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at <http://osca.lbcc.edu>.
6. Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <http://admissions.lbcc.edu/>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<http://schedule.lbcc.edu>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

\*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the years of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

**Career Opportunities**

This **Associate Degree or Certificate of Achievement** is a two-year program leading to the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree. It is designed to prepare students for employment in a variety of computer related fields. Students wishing a bachelor's degree (transfer program) should meet with a counselor to discuss transferability of courses.

**Program Mission and Outcomes**

The mission of the Computer Security and Networking curriculum is to skillfully train students by providing strategically designed courses to meet their academia, transferable, and career needs.

**Outcomes:**

- Install, configure, manage and troubleshoot a small office/home office network (wired or wireless)
- Secure wired and wireless networks
- Install, configure and manage client and server operating systems
- Harden servers against intrusion.

**Outcomes for Certificate of Accomplishment (Microsoft Windows Networking Technician):**

- Set up and construct a secure peer-to-peer and client server network.
- Install, configure, and backup to mobile device.
- Understand Operating System Configuration.
- Understand server roles.

**Outcomes for Certificate of Accomplishment (Cyber Security):**

- Set up and construct a secure peer-to-peer and client server network.
- Install, configure, and backup mobile devices.
- Understand Operating System Configurations.
- Understand server roles.

**Outcomes for Certificate of Accomplishment (Computer Hardware Technician):**

- Analyze common software and hardware problems on personal computers.
- Distinguish and explain the introductory core computer and IT concepts and technology that are used personally in society, in society, in government, and business.

**Outcomes for Certificate of Accomplishment (Computer Network Technician):**

- Distinguish the differences between local area networks and wireless networking technologies.
- Compare and contrast various wired and wireless networking technologies.

**Outcomes for Certificate of Accomplish (UNIX Network Administrator):**

- Install, configure, and secure a LINUX server.
- Install, configure and secure a LINUX network and services.
- Describe and document a LINUX network in relation to the OSI model.
