The Vice President, Academic Affairs, shall administer these procedures.

Students with a Baccalaureate or a Higher Degree

- A. Nursing students who have already earned a baccalaureate or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning are not required to complete any general education requirements or graduation proficiencies that may be required for an associate degree. Instead, these students need to complete only the coursework necessary for licensing as a registered nurse.
- B. Section A notwithstanding, students with an earned baccalaureate or higher degree will be required to take all courses required for the nursing major that have not been completed previously.

Application to the Nursing Program: Prospective students must complete and submit the nursing application and any requested supporting documentation including, but not limited to, transcripts, in accordance with posted deadlines.

As outlined in Section 1424(d) of the Board of Registered Nursing, the Associate Degree in Nursing program shall have sufficient resources to achieve the program's objectives.

As outlined in Section 1424(g) of the Board of Registered Nursing, faculty members of the Associate Degree in Nursing program shall have the primary responsibility for developing, implementing, and evaluating all aspects of the program.
