FACULTY EXAMINE EQUITY AND SUCCESS FOR THEIR COURSES

More than 30 faculty members participated in LBCC's first ever "Summer Curriculum Audit: Redesigning Our Courses for Equity and Success" on Aug. 13 at the Pacific Coast Campus.

Participants from all across campus worked individually or in teams to redesign their curriculum and pedagogy for a specific course with a focus on enhancing the equitable success of their students. These departments included Anthropology, Art History, Biology, Communications, Counseling, History, Library, Math, Nutrition, Political Science, Psychology, Reading, and Sociology.

Goals were set and current practices in the following areas were analyzed:

- Course Content
- The Classroom Experience
- Assignments and Assessments
- Grading and Feedback

"We especially looked for ways to be more culturally representative and responsive in these areas, as well as finding ways to make the course content relevant to student lives, more engaging, and more empowering and transformational for students," said Dr. Matthew Lawrence, Student Equity Coordinator.



MALAUULU, NTUK TO LEAD LONG BEACH Community College District Board of Trustees

Trustee Vivian Malauulu was elected President of the Long Beach Community College District Board of Trustees and Trustee Uduak-Joe Ntuk was elected Vice President at the Board's July 24 meeting. In this role, Malauulu will preside over the meetings of the Board and act as chief spokesperson for the Board, among other duties. The positions are elected annually among the five Board members, to a one-year term.

In 2016, Malauulu was the first Latina elected to the LBCCD Board of Trustees to represent Area 2. She has a bachelor's degree in Journalism from California State University, Northridge, a master's degree in Educational Administration from California State University, Dominguez Hills, and four K-14 bilingual teaching credentials. Malauulu is a full-time registered longshore worker with Local 13 of the International Longshore and Warehouse Union (ILWU) at the Long Beach/Los Angeles twinports complex. She is currently one of only six titled officers for Local 13 and oversees the welfare and pension benefits of more than 10,000 members, retirees, and their dependents. In 2018, she became the first woman in the ILWU's 81-year history to be elected to that office as the local's Health Benefits Representative.



Ntuk was elected in 2018 and he is the first African-American male elected to serve since LBCC's founding. He earned his Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts at LBCC, a Bachelor of Science in Chemical Engineering at California State University, Long Beach, and his Master of Science in Engineering at the University of Southern California. He currently serves as the Director of Petroleum Administration for the City of Los Angeles.


