LONG BEACH CITY COLLEGE AWARDED GRANT TO SUPPORT VETERAN ENTREPRENEURIAL PROGRAMS

\$50,000 Grant Will Boost Training and Advising Programs

LONG BEACH, California – (May 30, 2014) – The *Long Beach City College* (LBCC) *Small Business Development Center* (SBDC) has been awarded a \$50,000 grant from *The Blackstone Charitable Foundation* in support of veterans' employment and business development programs offered through LBCC's College Advancement and Economic Development (CAED) department.

"As a veteran myself, I am well aware of the unique qualities and skills veterans of our armed services bring to the workforce," said Eloy Ortiz Oakley, LBCC President. "The Blackstone grant will allow the SBDC here at LBCC to further invest in entrepreneurial training programs our veterans are seeking to help them advance with their goals of launching a small business."

Long Beach City College was selected through a *Request for Proposal* (RFP) process presented last November. Over two hundred organizations submitted proposals with six groups selected to receive grants totaling \$300,000 to support veterans' hiring and entrepreneurship.

"Too often, those who put their lives at risk in service of our nation do not receive adequate support when they leave active service. We are proud to extend funding to support veterans' hiring and foster entrepreneurship in the military community," said Amy Stursberg, Executive Director of the Blackstone Charitable Foundation. "Veterans bring a dynamic set of qualifications to a diverse group of industries, and it is our duty to help them re-enter the workforce."

"This grant will allow LBCC to create an extensive training and advising program that will foster entrepreneurship within the veteran population we serve," said Lou Anne Bynum, Executive Vice President at Long Beach City College. "We continue to strive to meet the demands of our military veterans who are looking for new avenues of opportunity and this grant will further our ability to invest in our veterans' futures."

Long Beach City College operates the Los Angeles Small Business Development Network and the Long Beach SBDC Service Center. The grant funds will support consulting and training programs for veteran entrepreneurs through the Long Beach SBDC in collaboration with The Jonas Project.
