Registration resumes on January 27th - Classes begin on February 3rd

Long Beach, California – There is still time to enroll in classes during Long Beach City College’s Spring Semester. LBCC is offering a wide range of courses that has something for every type of student. Whether you are a recent high school graduate, a current student preparing to graduate or transfer to a four-year institution or are looking for career training or to learn a new skill, LBCC offers courses to help achieve your academic and career goals.

There are a wide-variety of academic and career classes available to students. Some high demand career fields – like Architecture & Drafting and Metal Fabrication & Sheet Metal have many openings for students.

Students seeking to attend Long Beach City College (LBCC) during its Spring Semester beginning on Monday, February 3, are encouraged to visit the college website at www.LBCC.edu/schedule to find open classes.

Students can register for open classes beginning on Monday, January 27. New students must apply for admission to LBCC prior to enrollment and should submit their application immediately so they can register for classes.
