

Registered Nursing (RN/ADN) Program **Application Requirements**

PROFICIENCIES

We do not accept assessment test results from other schools. If you have a bachelor's degree you may not be required to meet proficiency requirements as mandated by SB 1393. *For more information refer to the graduation proficiency requirements section under Plan A of the General Education Plan or see a Counselor*

READING: You must attach the LBCC Assessment Test printout stating "Reading Proficiency Met" to your application or successful completion of READ 82 or 83 is required. *For more information see a Counselor.*

MATH: LBCC Assessment Test printout stating the level of Math meets the proficiency requirement or successful completion in a college Math course at the level of Math 110, Math 110B, Math 130, 130A or higher. *To determine which level of Math is required, please see a Counselor.*

INFORMATION COMPETENCY: (Information/Technology) or COMPUTER PROFICIENCY: You must meet graduation requirements. *For more information see a Counselor.*

PREREQUISITES

ENGLISH: Completed at LBCC with a passing grade or successful completion of a college English course at the level of English 105 or 1 from another college/university that has been equivalency approved by the English Dept. Chair. *To determine which level of English is required, please see a Counselor.*

SCIENCES: ANATOMY 1 (Human Anatomy), **PHYSIOLOGY 1** (Human Physiology), and **BIOLOGY 2** (General Microbiology). Life Science courses must have a combined GPA of 2.5 or higher and be completed within five (5) years prior to the application deadline. *Courses taken at another college/university must be evaluated for equivalency by the Life Science Dept. Chair. You may use the Nursing and Allied Health "Life Science Department Equivalency Form." available in C-100C, for course equivalency evaluation for application purposes.*

The following information must also be included with your application:

- **HIGH SCHOOL/GED (mandatory):** All applicants must provide a copy of a High School transcript/diploma or GED certificate. International transcripts must be evaluated by ACEI (Academic Credentials Evaluation Institute, Inc.). For additional information their website is www.acei.com.
- **OVERALL/CUMULATIVE GPA** must be 2.5 or higher; based on all grades from all colleges attended. Attach an unofficial transcript of LBCC courses and an official, sealed transcript from all other colleges. *Classes taken at other colleges must be evaluated and approved for equivalency. Make an appointment with the LBCC Counseling Office at 562-938-4560 and give the Counselor an official transcript to submit for evaluation.*
- **INFORMATION MEETING (highly recommended):** Attendance is taken. Meetings are generally held on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays during Sept., Oct., Nov., Dec., Feb., March, April, May and June (no meetings in January, July, or August) Bldg. C, from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in classroom C101, No food, drinks or children allowed in classrooms. Reservations are not required, but the meetings are subject to change and/or cancellation.
- **SELF-ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE:** Attach a stamped, self-addressed envelope, size 9 1/2" x 4" (available at LBCC Bookstore) to your application.
