Each student must have earned a 3.5 GPA for six consecutive semesters in high school and since graduation has enrolled full time at Long Beach City College

Friends of Languages Scholarship

The *Friends of Languages* Associate Group at Long Beach City College provides scholarships to current graduating seniors from the Long Beach Unified School District who plan to take language courses at Long Beach City College. Students who receive the Friends of Languages scholarship must maintain a 3.0 GPA overall with a 3.2 GPA in language courses and take one language course each semester.

Rotary Club of Long Beach Scholarship

The *Rotary Club of Long Beach* established their scholarship to assist current graduating seniors from any Long Beach Unified District High School as well as local private and parochial high schools. In order to be eligible, students must be a U.S. Citizen and reside within the district. Students must be planning to attend Long Beach City College or California State University, Long Beach full time and maintain a 2.0 GPA. The emphasis of this scholarship is on students who choose vocational, technical or academic programs.

Rotary Club of Long Beach, Honors Scholarship

The *Rotary Club of Long Beach Honors Scholarship* was established for students from the Long Beach Unified School District who apply to the Honors Program at Long Beach City College. Student must meet the criteria and follow guidelines of the Honors program, maintain full-time enrollment and a 3.0 GPA.
