



WORLD TRADE WEEK 2012 COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

The World Trade Week 2012 Education Committee is sponsoring several \$1000 scholarships for students intending to pursue a career in international trade. The qualifications include:

1. **Full-time Student:** A candidate must be enrolled in a full-time academic program relating to international trade. If a student's major does not have an international dimension, international trade course work will suffice.
2. **Internship:** A candidate must have completed or be in the process of completing at least a quarter or semester internship with an international business, organization, or association of the Los Angeles international trade community.
3. **Internship Report:** A candidate must submit a one-page internship report. This brief report should describe what the candidate did as part of the internship and include what the candidate learned and how he or she benefited from the internship.
4. **Letter of Recommendation:** A letter of recommendation from the faculty member who supervised the student's internship or from the student's supervisor at the internship site.
5. **Future Mentor:** A candidate must be willing to become a future international trade mentor to other students once she or he has become an international business professional.

The purpose of the scholarships is to foster international trade education and international business development. In establishing this scholarship program, the Committee hopes to develop a network of international trade professionals who would be willing to provide mentoring to future students wanting to enter the field of international business.

The deadline for submission and receipt of the materials described above is **5 p.m., Friday, April 6, 2012.** Applications will be reviewed and winners notified by mid-April. The scholarship recipients will be awarded in the first week of May at the annual Kickoff-off Breakfast in downtown Los Angeles. Winners must be present to accept the award and provide proof of enrollment in applicable classes at a valid university or college in order to receive the scholarship check.

To apply:

1. Complete an internship in international trade.
2. Write a one-page internship report.
3. Request a letter of recommendation.
4. Submit the internship report, letter of recommendation, and a copy of your resume to the following:
