GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

For CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT:

Complete the required units with a minimum grade of "C" in each course and a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 ("C" average). Fifty per cent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration must be completed in residence (credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included).

For ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE:

NOTE: Effective Fall 2009, Title 5, section 55063 (a) (2) requires that students must complete each course counted toward the major or area of emphasis with a grade of "C" or better or "P" if the course is taken on a "Pass/No Pass" basis.

Complete the required 18 – 18.5 units with a minimum of 2.5 grade point average. In addition, complete the A. A. degree requirements specified in the Catalog. <u>The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration need to be from the same catalog year</u>. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout (see the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment"). Fifty per cent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration must be completed in residence (credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included).

In general, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

NOTE: To receive a certificate or degree you must submit completed application forms in the Admissions and Records Office during your final semester of course work.

Students are encouraged to complete the English and Math proficiency requirements at the start of the program. For additional information, please call (562) 938-4192 or 938-4454.
