#### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

#### For **CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT**:

This certificate is a one to two year program in occupational/technical areas at Long Beach City College which provide training in job skills and employment opportunities. Complete the required units with a minimum grade of "C" in each course and a minimum grade point average of 3.0. Fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration must be completed in residence (credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included).

**NOTE**: To receive a certificate you must submit completed application forms in the Admissions and Records Office during your final semester of course work.

Students interested in transferring to a university to continue their study in this field of concentration or other majors are strongly advised to consult an LBCC academic counselor and refer to the ASSIST website (<u>www.assist.org</u>) for major preparation information.
