#### Associate Degree requirements continued from the previous page:

- 1. **Scholarship:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this **field of concentration, complete each course above** with a **grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis, and **minimum gpa in the concentration of 2.5**.
- 2. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 3. **Residence for the Field of Concentration**: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at **least 16 17 units** of the required 32 32.5 must be **completed at Long Beach City College**. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 4. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements\*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <a href="http://admissions.lbcc.edu/">http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</a>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<a href="http://schedule.lbcc.edu">http://schedule.lbcc.edu</a>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

\*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

#### Fashion Design:

Students prepare for entry-level jobs in fashion design, production & manufacturing. This program also provides partial lower division preparation for the baccalaureate degree in Fashion Design.

#### Job Opportunities:

Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. With beginning starting salary ranging from: \$10/hour - \$25/hour. Designer, Production Manager, Pattern Drafter, Pattern Grader, Technical Designer, Quality Control, Shipping Manager, Sample-maker, Textile Designer, and Manufacturers Representative.

The Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position in the apparel design and manufacturing industry.

This <u>Associate Degree</u> will prepare students for career advancement once a certificate has been earned. Field of concentration selection will also facilitate transfer in a related major.
