For graduation with an **Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree with a major in Fashion Design:**

- Minimum Unit Requirements:** §Any course that appears on a curriculum guide and the General Education Pattern (Plan A) may fulfill both major and general education requirements (Approved by College Curriculum Committee Spring 2012). For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.

- Scholarship:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this **field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis, and **minimum GPA in the concentration of 2.5**.
- Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 semester units of the required 60 semester units in residence at Long Beach City College in order for the college to grant an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science Degree.
- Residence for the Field of Concentration:** Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means **at least 18 units** of the required 35.5-36 must be **completed at Long Beach City College**. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.

## Career Opportunities

### Fashion Design:

Students prepare for entry-level jobs in fashion design, production & manufacturing. This program also provides partial lower division preparation for the baccalaureate degree in Fashion Design.

Job Opportunities: Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. With beginning starting salary ranging from: \$10/hour - \$25/hour. Designer, Production Manager, Pattern Drafter, Pattern Grader, Technical Designer, Quality Control, Shipping Manager, Sample-maker, Textile Designer, and Manufacturers Representative.

The Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position in the apparel design and manufacturing industry.

This Associate Degree will prepare students for career advancement once a certificate has been earned. Field of concentration selection will also facilitate transfer in a related major.

### Fashion Design—Patternmaker:

Job Opportunities: Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. Starting salary ranges from: \$10/hour - \$20/hour. Production Manager, Pattern Drafter, Pattern Grader, Quality Control, Samplemaker, Technical Designer.

### Fashion Design—Samplemaker:

Job Opportunities: Salary will depend on ability, experience and skills. Starting salary range: \$8/hour - \$20/hour. Samplemaker, Sample Cutter, Quality Control.

## Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of the Fashion Design Program at LBCC is to provide students with discipline specific skills to communicate effectively, think critically, and possess the knowledge of technology essential to employment in design related occupations within the fashion industry or the requisite foundation for transfer to a 4-year college or university.

- Create an environment that promotes critical thinking, creativity, teamwork, soft skills, multicultural and global awareness and understanding of social organizational and technological systems.
- Provide educational opportunities in the field of fashion for career employment, advanced study & professional.
- Predict fashion trends and analyze form, silhouette, proportion, texture and drape of fabric to develop a fashion line for a target customer.
