ABOUT LBCC'S ANTHROPOLOGY PROGRAM

The mission of Long Beach City College's Anthropology program is to present anthropology as the scientific global study of the biological and cultural aspects of humankind throughout time. This program will also prepare students to transfer successfully to a bachelor's degree program at the university level.

Anthropology is a broad field that appeals to students with interests ranging from genetics to social justice. Our program provides hands-on experience to explore the discipline and its countless uses. Training in anthropology will prepare students for any career that takes place in a multicultural setting.

ASSOCIATE IN ARTS FOR TRANSFER (AA-T), ANTHROPOLOGY

The Associate in Arts for Transfer degree prepares students for a broad range of careers in which effective reasoning, research, and communication skills are essential. The AA-T degree also provides a number of benefits for students planning to transfer to the Cal State University (CSU) system, including:

- Guaranteed admission into a CSU school as an Anthropology major
- Students will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree

The Long Beach City College Anthropology Program offers introductory courses focusing in all four of the primary subfields of anthropology: Cultural, Physical, Linguistic, and Archaeology.

- ANTHR 10 Magic, Witchcraft and Religion
- ANTHR 2 & 2H Cultural Anthropology/ Honors Cultural Anthropology
- ANTHR 3 & 3H Intro To Archaeology/ Honors Intro To Archaeology
- ANTHR 4 Linguistic Anthropology
- ANTHR 11 Physical Anthropology Lecture and Lab



There are dedicated laboratories for physical anthropology and archaeology, providing students with the opportunity to use the equipment used by professionals in the field.

Students also have the opportunity to work in tandem with faculty and fellow majors through the LBCC Anthropology Student Association, providing unique experiences to engage with anthropology outside the classroom.
