STUDENT PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS

The rigor and performance expectations are identical to first year Composition courses taught at state universities or private colleges.

The major difference between the options is that the ENGLISH 1 PLUS Support (ENGLISH 896) meets for one additional hour, twice a week. This extra time is a part of the 2-unit corequisite support course designed to help students be successful in ENGLISH 1.
