- CERTIFICATE PROGRAM: Use ONLY the curriculum guide (white) for your field of concentration (LBCC major).

- CSU OR UC TRANSFER PROGRAM: Each year, select courses from the updated Plan B or Plan C and the colored curriculum guide for your major found in the counseling center.
- CSU OR UC TRANSFER AND ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM: See a counselor to use Plan B or C while achieving Associate Degree General Education Require ments.

- CATALOG RIGHTS: Students are guaranteed that the requirements in effect at the time of first enrollment at LBCC will remain in effect as long as the conditions of CONTINUOUS ENROLLMENT are met. Units earned and credited to the CSU and IGETC patterns will be certified by LBCC so long as taken from a valid list.
- ALTERNATIVE GENERAL EDUCATION PLANS: There are several ways to complete the General Education requirements for transfer to a CSU or UC program. Consult a counselor to determine the best approach for you.
- PRIVATE INSTITUTION REQUIREMENTS: The General Education requirements of private institutions vary widely. Consult the institution, its catalog, the transfer center and a counselor to develop an appropriate plan for your needs.
