

NONRESIDENT TUITION FEE WAIVER

The nonresident tuition fee waiver is not a substitute for determining state residency or meeting eligibility AB-540 criteria. Instead, it provides eligible students an exception of out-of-state tuition fees, regardless of legal status or in-state residency requirements. LBCC shall establish procedures regarding collection, waiver, and refunds of nonresident tuition. The waiver allows students to pay the in-state tuition rate per unit instead of CA nonresident tuition fees.

This form will be used to determine if you meet the exemption requirements established by LBCCD. If these guidelines apply to you, fill out this form, attach documentation, and submit it to the Admissions & Records Office at admissions@lbcc.edu

1. Is this for undocumented students only?

This waiver is for students, regardless of legal status, who do not meet AB-540 eligibility, and their financial need makes it challenging to pay out-of-state tuition.

2. How is the waiver policy different from Expanding Nonresident Tuition Exemption through CA Education Code, § 76140 (a)(1)(2): "The Six Unit Policy."?

The waiver would allow students, regardless of legal status, to pay the in-state tuition rate per unit instead of CA nonresident fees. Students pay for their enrollment units plus student fees (I.e., health, course materials, etc.).

3. How can students be eligible for the out-of-state waiver?

Students must meet the criteria established below, complete Nonresident Tuition Waiver and submit appropriate documentation to Admissions & Records every semester.

4. Are international students eligible?

Students with valid F, J, or M visas are not eligible for the waiver.

5. When will I know if I'm granted the non-resident tuition waiver?

Students will be notified by Admissions & Records, and students can check their tuition balance in the Student Account tile in their Viking Portal.

6. Who can I contact if I have questions regarding my student account?

7. Will I be eligible for financial aid in the future?

Students must meet the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> or <u>CA Dream Act Application</u> requirements, and the Financial Aid office is available to assist students.
