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

ASSOCIATE IN ARTS FOR TRANSFER (AA-T), PHILOSOPHY

The Associate in Arts for Transfer degree in Philosophy is designed to guide students in the exploration of diverse philosophical ideas and to enhance their critical thinking, logic, and imaginative skills.

Students who complete the Philosophy AA-T will be able to explain and analyze various philosophical problems with both academic and practical applications. They will be able to utilize critical thinking and logic skills in philosophical contexts as well as in other academic and non-academic areas.

The AA-T degree provides a number of benefits for students planning to transfer to the Cal State University (CSU) system, including:

- Guaranteed admission into a CSU school as a Philosophy major
- Students will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a Bachelor's degree
