CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Career opportunities for the Social Justice Studies program are expected to grow nationwide through 2029, with salaries for careers associated with this program ranging from \$39,000 to more than \$208,000, with an average salary of \$96,000. ABOUT THE SOCIAL JUSTICE STUDIES PROGRAM

The Social Justice Studies program at Long Beach City College provides students with an interdisciplinary understanding of the concepts, theories, and methods related to social injustices based on social class, gender, sexuality, race, culture, ethnicity, religion, disability, language, and other statuses in order to create a more equitable society.

This LBCC program is designed for students who care deeply about an array of social justice issues and provides a Social Sciences understanding of the systemic roots of inequity as well as potential solutions and remedies to social injustices.

LBCC offers core courses in philosophy and sociology as well as electives in a variety of other disciplines. Beyond traditional curriculum the focus is placed on social justice issues in the greater Long Beach community, linking students with local community organizing efforts and social justice organizations.

The Social Justice Studies Associate Degree for Transfer (AD-T) is designed to prepare students to transfer to the California State University (CSU) system where they will receive preferential transfer status for a Social Justice Studies major or a related discipline.

- Guaranteed admission into a CSU school as a Social Justice Studies major or a related discipline
- Students will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree
