LBCC's Sociology program focuses on the science of human behavior. Introductory courses explore the development of personality, the role of culture, group dynamics, and social organization and institutions. Students also learn research design, methodology, analytical and interpretation skills to help students think critically about society and social issues. Advanced classes focus on modern social problems, race and ethnic relations, sociology of the family, and the Latinx experience in the United States.
