

THEIR APPROACH

The first Pillar of guided pathways is to "Clarify the Path" by creating clear pathways to employment and further education. LBCC faculty have thoughtfully sequenced courses for all their awards. Additionally, LBCC and CSU Long Beach have been working closely together to create 4-year roadmaps from LBCC through CSULB so students are able to clearly see what courses they need to complete for their bachelor's degree. We are excited to announce that the top transfer majors to CSULB Roadmaps are now available through the digital Program Mapper system. The Program Mapper is accessible on the department web pages currently and will be available in other locations on the LBCC website soon. Below is an image of the Pathways Program Mapper.

WHAT THEY ARE DOING

The Pathways Program Mapper team is led by GP Coordinators Heather Dy and Anthony Hayes as well as several counselors, technical support, and classified staff who are inputting the roadmaps into the system. The goal is to have all awards (degrees and certificates) in the Program Mapper by end of Spring 22.



WHAT THEY ARE LEARNING

The Mapper team continues to refine the process. Working with the Curriculum Committee, roadmap templates are submitted by faculty when proposing new awards or modifying existing ones. Faculty also will review existing awards through the Department Planning/Program Review process. As the Pathways Program Mapper continues to be implemented, faculty will have the opportunity to modify their sequenced courses, if needed.
