SHS will inform Risk Exposure to others


SHS remains HIPAA compliant and we do not share names or medical records with others, including instructors

Notifications are sent directly to positive students and close contacts, SHS does not notify instructors about possible situations in the classrooms. The general district wide email is also sent to allow everyone know there is a possibility of exposure in that building. This allows individuals to be vigilant in their own personal healthy decisions, or could be used as reminder to wear your mask on campus, or make changes in the classroom experience.
